# DCC asks SLAs to implement various regulatory decisions of CDSCO with priority for uniformity

**1<sup>st</sup> July, 2025:**

The Drugs Consultative Committee (DCC), the advisory committee that advises the Central and State Governments on matters that require uniform implementation across the country, has recommended to the State Licensing Authorities (SLAs) to cooperate with the Central drug regulator on implementation of various regulatory decisions with priority for uniformity.

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
